



Criminal Justice Technology Associate in Science Degree

The Associate in Science degree in Criminal Justice is designed to prepare the student for a full range of career opportunities in the field of criminal justice. The degree provides a strong background for employment with any of Southwest Florida's many criminal justice or public service agencies, including police departments, sheriff's offices, prisons, areas of juvenile justice, or private industry.

Students intending to continue toward a Bachelor's degree are encouraged to choose electives recommended for university transfer. The Associate in Science degree in Criminal Justice Technology transfers directly into the Edison College Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Public Safety Management. The degree also transfers directly into any public Florida college or university's Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice.

The Criminal Justice Academy Bridge Program

The Edison College Criminal Justice Academy Bridge Program is designed for student successfully completing Florida Department of Law Enforcement's Criminal Justice Standards & Training Commission Basic Recruit Academies for Law Enforcement Officer and/or Correctional Officers. Upon completion of program prerequisites, qualified students are eligible for 12-16 credit hours of elective credit in the AS degree in Criminal Justice Technology. In addition, selected degree core requirements can be met through an accelerated study format. Course requirements for the accelerated study format will include research projects and essays. All coursework earned through the Academy Bridge Program will demonstrate advanced, independent, and critical thinking skills expected within college level coursework.

Tuition and Fees

Edison College is a comprehensive public college. The cost per credit hour at the time of this publication is \$70.69 per credit hour for Florida residents and \$265.46 per credit hour for non-Florida residents. Other fees may include \$20.00 for an initial application fee, as well as applicable lab fees and textbooks.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE ACADEMY BRIDGE PROGRAM (Effective Fall 2007)

The Criminal Justice Academy Bridge program is designed for students that have successfully completed Florida Department of Law Enforcement's Criminal Justice Standards & Training Commission (CJSTC) Basic Recruit Academy in Law Enforcement and/or Corrections. The program is designed to articulate CJSTC Academy post-secondary adult vocational (PSAV) training into the Associate in Science degree in Criminal Justice Technology.

Part 1: COMPLETE ACADEMY BRIDGE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Prior to the award of college credit through the Criminal Justice Academy Bridge Program, the student must:

1. Complete an initial advising appointment with the Criminal Justice Program Coordinator or the Program Advisor. Call (239) 489-9392 to schedule an appointment to see Kim Gresham, Program Coordinator, or (239) 985-3425 to see the program advisor.
2. Complete all Edison College entrance requirements, including entrance testing.
3. Declare a major in the Criminal Justice Technology Associate in Science degree (Major Code - AS CRJT).
4. Complete at least 16 hours of coursework at Edison College.
5. Upon request, produce proof of eligibility for Florida certification as a Law Enforcement and/or Corrections Officer certification.

PART 2: ACADEMY BRIDGE AFFILIATED COURSEWORK

Selected career core requirements can be met through a directed study format. Requirements for each course will include research projects, essays, and advanced college level writing assignments designed to demonstrate the advanced and independent critical thinking skills expected within college level course work. Eligible Academy Bridge student will, with coordinator permission, to register in a directed study format for the following courses based on their Florida law enforcement and/or corrections certification.
